The Fellows of the American Association of Nurse Practitioners (FAANP) impacts national and global health by engaging recognized nurse practitioner (NP) leaders who make outstanding contributions to clinical practice, research, education, or policy to enhance the AANP mission. From invitational Think Tanks to the Mentorship Program, FAANP is dedicated to advancing the NP profession.

The Fellows of the American Association of Nurse Practitioners (FAANP) program was established by the American Academy of Nurse Practitioners (AANP) in 2000 to recognize nurse practitioner leaders who have made outstanding contributions to health care through nurse practitioner (NP) clinical practice, research, education, or policy and to provide a forum through which to extend and enhance such efforts. In 2013, FAANP became Fellows of the American Association of Nurse Practitioners with the merger of two national NP organizations. Priority initiatives of FAANP are the development of leadership and mentorship programs for nurse practitioners and nurse practitioner students. All active members maintain current membership in both AANP and FAANP. The FAANP leadership reports to the AANP Board of Directors.

2016 Loretta C. Ford Award



Rosemary T. Goodyear, EdD, APRN-BC, FAANP

Dr. Goodyear is an Independent Consultant with Nurse Consultant Associates and a Family Nurse Practitioner. She has been a nurse practitioner for over 35 years and has been dedicated to the education of nurse practitioners. Throughout her career, Dr. Goodyear has risen to professional heights as an educator and mentor, consultant, Fulbright Scholar, entrepreneur, and leader in resolving issues important to professional practice. During her career she established and/or reorganized over 10 nurse practitioner programs in several major universities throughout the United States and internationally. Her entrepreneurship as she launched her own nurse practitioner business practice for the delivery of health services was a pioneering, creative innovation unheard of at the time.

Dr. Goodyear's research focuses on outcomes of nurse practitioner practice, particularly cost effective care. She is also politically active, having worked on such policies as the rural Health Clinics Act in 1974 and currently works with NP/APNs in the international community by assisting to establish the NP/APN role, author policy and establish educational programs and regulations. On retirement she has consulted as well as volunteered with INP/APN Network of the International Council of Nurses.

As an early NP pioneer with sustained contributions, Dr. Goodyear has served as a role model to innumerable others in the areas of practice and academic innovations. Her international service, research and scholarship has expanded communication and collaboration between nurses of all countries.

2016 New Honorary Fellow Inductee



Peter I. Buerhaus, PhD, RN, FAAN, FAANP(H)

Dr. Peter Buerhaus is a nurse and healthcare economist, known for his studies and publications focused on the nursing and physician workforces in the United States. He is a Professor of Nursing and Director of the Center for Interdisciplinary Health Workforce Studies at Montana State University. Before coming to Montana State University, Dr. Buerhaus was the Valere Potter Distinguished Professor of Nursing (2000-2015) and Professor of Health Policy (2013-2015) at Vanderbilt University, and assistant professor of health policy and management at Harvard School of Public Health (1992-2000). During the 1980s he served as assistant to the Vice Provost for Medical Affairs, the chief executive of the medical center (1987-1990), and as assistant to the chief executive officer of The University of Michigan Medical Center's seven teaching hospitals (1983-1986).

Dr. Buerhaus maintains an active research program involving studies on the economics of the nursing workforce, forecasting nurse and physician supply, developing and testing measures of hospital quality of care, determining public and provider opinions on issues involving the delivery of health care, and assessing the quantity and quality of health care provided by nurse practitioners. Of the nearly 120 articles he has published in peer-reviewed journals, five publications are designated as "Classics" by the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) Patient Safety Network. Other publications have ranked among the most widely accessed articles published in the health policy journal *Health Affairs*. Dr. Buerhaus is co-author of the 2008 book *The Future of the Nursing Workforce in the United States: Data, Trends, and Implications*. He has editorial responsibilities with many peer reviewed health services research and nursing journals, and advises policy makers and legislators on the health workforce.

Dr. Buerhaus' outstanding leadership and productivity in nurse practitioner workforce research, research dissemination and related healthcare policy, has informed nurse practitioner education and practice and the foundational roles of registered nurses throughout the healthcare system.

Honorary Fellow—Posthumously



Senator Daniel K. Inouye, FAANP(H)

Senator Daniel K. Inouye was the second longest serving member of the U.S. Senate with a distinguished tenure of more than 49 years. As president pro tempore from 2010-2012—third in line of presidential succession—Senator Inouye was the highest-ranking public official of Asian descent in United States history. For his heroic actions as a member of the famed 442nd Regimental Combat Team—resulting in the loss of his right arm—the World War II veteran ultimately earned the nation’s highest award for military valor, the Medal of Honor. Senator Inouye frequently publically acknowledged the exceptional nursing care he had received following the injuries he suffered during his distinguished service in World War II.

During his career of public service, Senator Inouye was a tireless and unwavering champion of nurses and the nursing profession. His leadership was instrumental in passing the groundbreaking Nurse Reinvestment Act of 2002, and he continued to support nurses by the Registered Nurse Safe Staffing Act in every congressional session from 2003 until his death in 2012. In addition to legislative achievements, Senator Inouye was instrumental in creating the Graduate School of Nursing at the Uniformed Services University, which is now named the Daniel K. Inouye Graduate School of Nursing. Established in 1993 with a Family Nurse Practitioner Program, the Daniel K. Inouye Graduate School of Nursing is our nation’s university responsible for preparing nurses in the uniformed services. Senator Inouye was also instrumental in the establishment of the National Center for Nursing Research in 1985, and in the advancement of the Center to the creation of the National Institute of Nursing Research in 1993.

Senator Inouye’s creative and affective actions have advanced the role of the nurse practitioner which in turn have provided for better patient outcomes. Because of Senator Inouye’s efforts many of the programs that were created during his service have been sustained over time.

Senator Inouye is survived by his wife Irene Hirano Inouye, son Kenny Inouye and his wife Jessica, granddaughter Maggie, and step-daughter Jennifer Hirano.

Her contributions to the profession include curriculum development to prepare NP students for Certification in Advanced Diabetes Management and transitioning an ACNP program to online. Dr. Appel formulated a Middle Range theory as to why Southern African-American women have difficulty modifying CMR and has published more than 50 manuscripts/ research-data-based articles. She was awarded the Researcher in Minority Health by Southern Nurses Research Society and is a Health Disparities Scholar and Fellow of the American Heart Association.
